2. Unless otherwise specified, 'Not applicable' is code 6 for single column questions, code 66 for two column questions and so on.
3. Unless otherwise specified, 'Refusal' is code 7 for single column questions, code 77 for two column questions, and so on.
4. Unless otherwise specified, 'Don't Know' is code 8 for single column questions, code 88 for two column questions, and so on.
5. Unless otherwise specified, 'Not answered' is code 9 for single column questions, code 99 for two column questions, and so on.
6. Sections in brackets and italics were textfilled as appropriate on the interviewers' computers.
7. Routing instructions appear above the questions. A routing instruction should be considered to stay in force until the next routing instruction.
8. '(NOT ON SCREEN)' means that the question did not appear on the interviewers' or editors' screens. '(EDIT ONLY)' means it appeared on screen for the editors but not the interviewers
