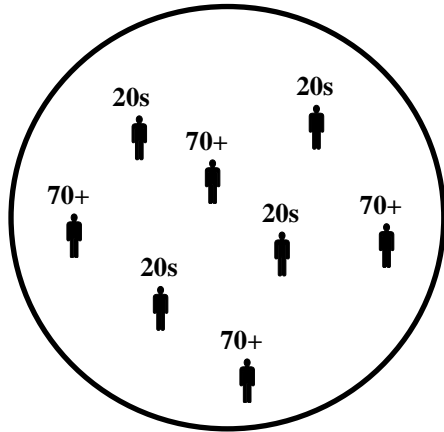

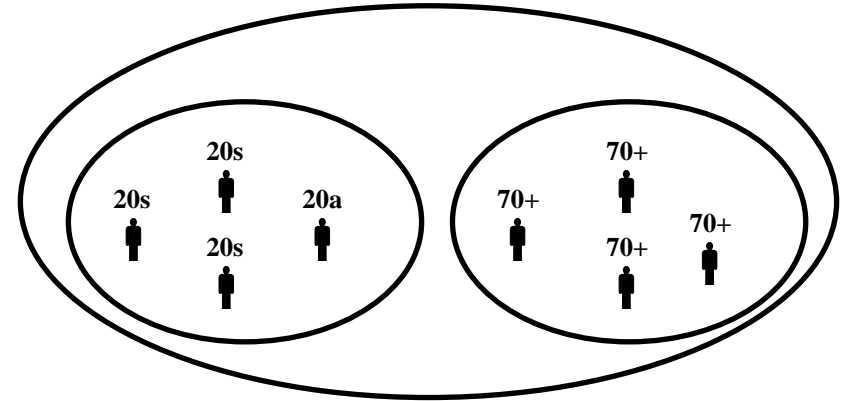

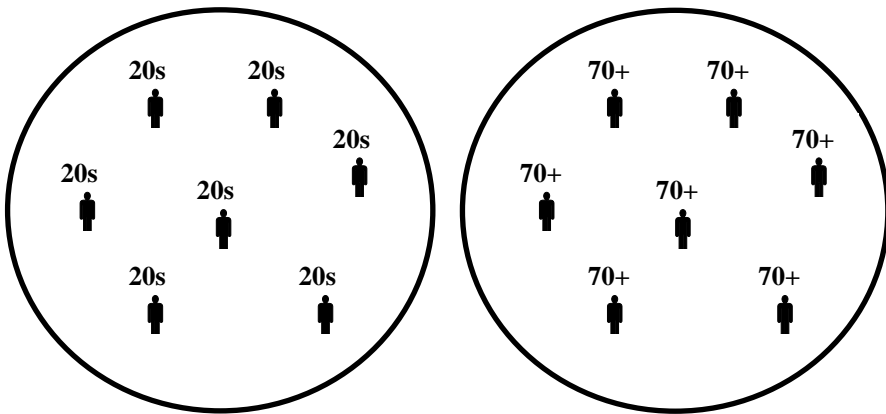
A: One group



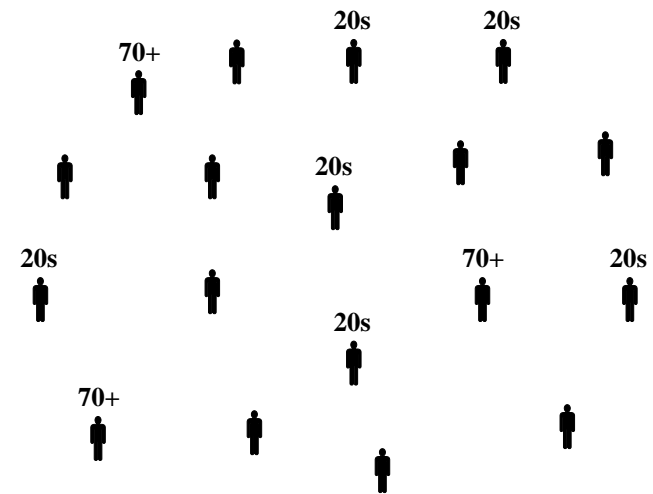
B: Two separate groups who are part of the same community

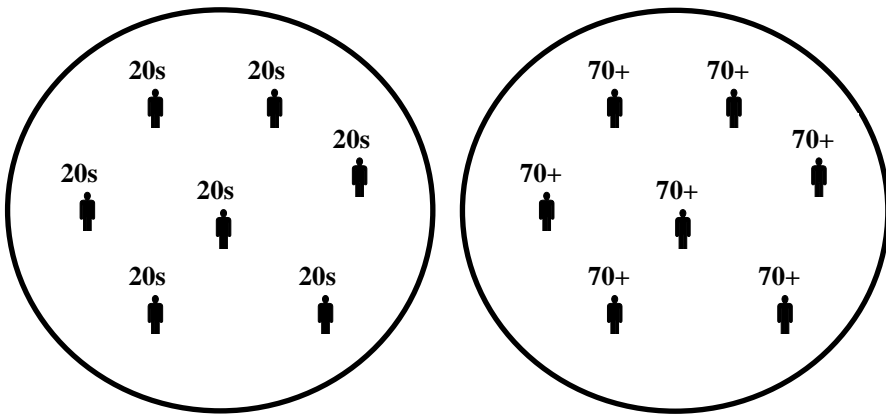

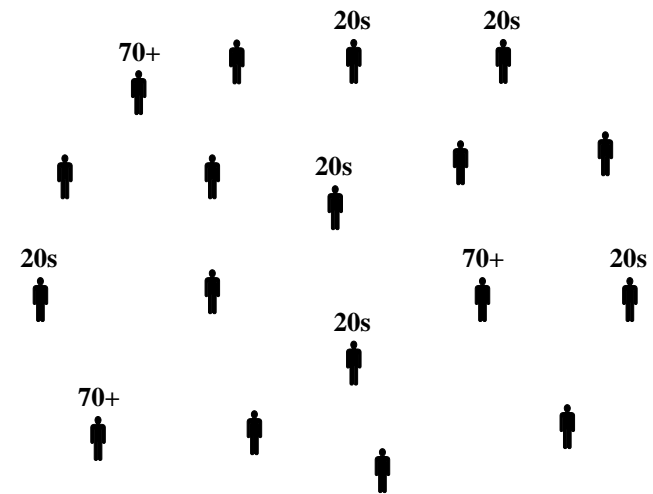

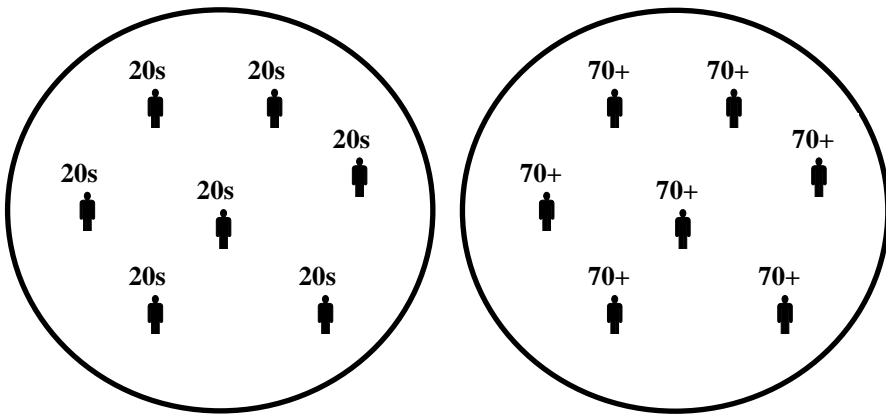

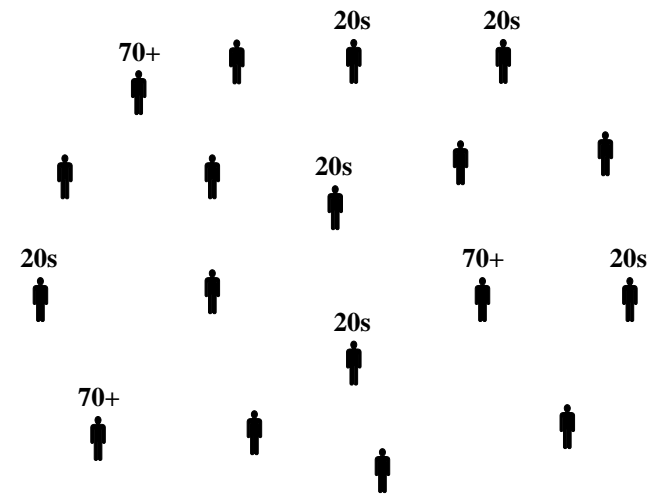

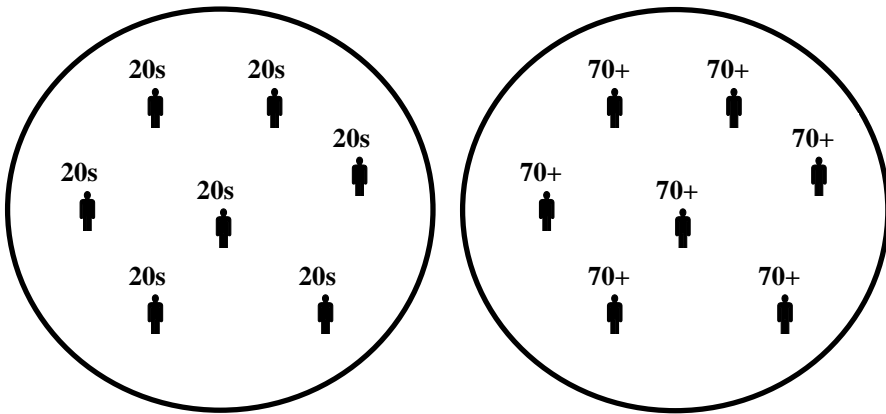

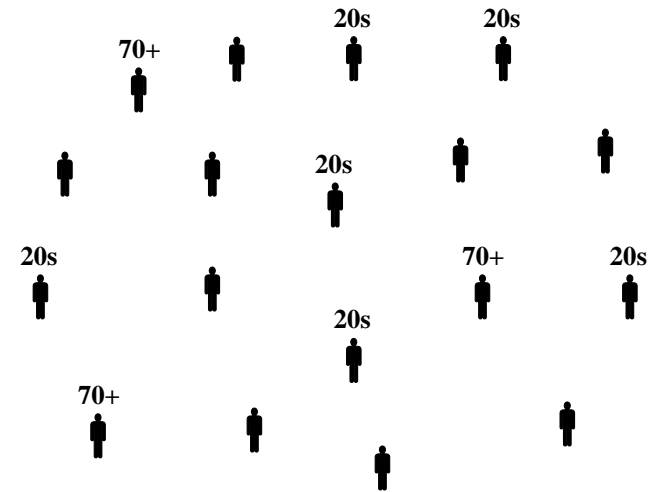
