## NOTE TO INTERVIEWERS

- Questions and showcards that have been excluded for Round 5 are noted in the questionnaire. Note that the remaining questions and showcards have not been renumbered. This means that there will be some gaps in the showcards numbering.
- Also, the showcards do not have 'letters' on them, which is different from our usual practice. Given that this is a Europe-wide survey which places a lot of emphasis on consistency across countries, we cannot add letters on the showcards.
- You must **read out the questions to respondents word by word**, even if you think the question can be asked in a better way. Paraphrasing is not allowed because we would like to administer the questions consistently across the UK and across Europe.
- Unless otherwise stated, if respondents have difficulty understanding some of the terminologies and cannot give an answer, please **code 'Don't know' rather than try to explain to them the meaning of the question to them in your own words.**
- You **must never act as an interpreter, or let someone else in the household interpret for the selected respondent** if s/he does not speak English.
- At some questions there are answer codes that appear in brackets in this questionnaire. These codes allow for answers respondents might give but should not be read out to them and must never appear on the showcards.
- For each question (apart from F2 and section J), there is a 'hidden' refused code that does not appear on screen, but which you can use by entering 'ref'.
- The answer codes on showcards should not generally be read out to respondents by the interviewer.
